Volunteer Role: Collections & Donations Volunteer

Join us and be part of a community supporting people to create a safe and supportive place to call home.

The Role

We are looking for a volunteer who is passionate about helping us to grow our recently launched 'Furnish A Future' – a donated furniture initiative which aims to support hundreds of adults and families in Glasgow moving on from homelessness.

Part of our Maintenance team, this role will be a huge help in supporting us in the collection and delivery of furniture donated by people within Glasgow and surrounding areas.

Your Role & Responsibilities

- Once a week we'd be looking for you to help coordinate the collection and delivery of household items to people across the city.
- Represent the values of Right There when engaging with people in the community.
- Potential heavy lifting of furniture.
- Physically fit to assist with the packing and unpacking of maintenance vans.
- Sorting and restoration of furniture contained in the maintenance yard.

- The ability to build (basic) flat-pack furniture.
- Confident and has experience using small (basic) tools where required.
- Commitment to establishing a flexible schedule to travel with maintenance across the city to deliver the service.
- An individual willing to use their own transport (van) would be welcomed by the charity but not a necessity as we have our own vans.
- A DC DMV drivers licence – over 25s, is required for this volunteering position.

What you can expect

Our values make us who we are and define our actions and behaviours every day. We expect our volunteers to uphold and represent our organisation in a way that reflects our values and person-centred way of working.



Support & Training

- We'll support you and provide the relevant induction, training in moving and handling, and health and safety training.
- We will offer a diverse range of training – should you demonstrate an interest in, we will support you to attend these sessions where appropriate.
- By working with us on a voluntary basis, you will get to experience the range of programmes and types of support we offer. Right There strive to offer people employment opportunities where our values are aligned.
- We advertise all social services vacancies as exempt under the terms of the rehabilitation of offender's act 1974 and rehabilitation of offender's act 1974 (exclusions and exceptions (Scotland) order 2003. A disclosure check would be completed, however, Right There will review any instances of previous offending on a case-by-case basis, as we understand that someone's past doesn't necessarily dictate their future.
